teen leadership program

- 122 youth served since opening (March 2021)
- Mar/Apr 2021: 6 youth per day \rightarrow Jan/Feb 2022: 9 youth per day
- 8 youth leaders (meet twice a month), 1 youth program assistant (works ~10 hrs)
- Current Grant Funding
 - TGYS: \$102,407.00 per year (until June 2023; includes all labor & indirect, plus base operating costs)
 - TGYS mini-grant: \$2,060 for this fiscal year (survey, volunteer appreciation, marketing)
 - GCYC OBH grant: ~\$2,000 per year (extra for food, trips)

Grants

<u>Substance Abuse Block Grant (Office of Behavioral Health)</u>

- \$150k per year, 5 years (exp. June 2025)
- Monthly reimbursement
- Covers ~75% of child care operations (inc. labor & fringe)
- Provides evidence-based prevention curriculum to youth K-10 in our community
 - Positive Action lessons in Childcare
 - Lifeskills classes in 3rd-10th grade health classes at Gilpin Schools
- Provides additional funding for teen program (EAGLE)
- Provides data collection and evaluation for youth substance use in our community
- Community Education

Grants

Child Care Stabilization and Workforce Sustainability (CDHS)

- ~\$20k family financial relief
- ~\$20k for general operating
- ~\$10k for staff retention/recruiting
- Provided in monthly stipends over 9 months

Grants

- ► **TGYS** (through CSUe)
- **\$102k** per year, 3 years
- Covers ~100% of EAGLE program costs (operating, labor, indirect), with extra funding from OBH toward supplies/trips
- Incorporates best youth development practices
 - Engages teen leaders in planning, marketing, and delivering programming
 - Provides employment for local youth
- Upstream substance use prevention by reducing community risk factors and promoting protective factors
