Background Information:

- From 2020-21: CSU Extension embarked on a year-long, formal community needs assessment (CNA) process
- Overarching goal: to more fully tell the story of our communities and Extension's role in our communities
- Methodology:
 - Mixed methods including secondary data analysis to make use of pre-existing information such as demographic reports, strategic plans, and health assessments
 - Key informant interviews to gather in-depth information to fill in understanding of select issues
 - Community surveys to quantify the prevalence of issues among a broad population of respondents
- Each County Extension determined the set of issues for which it could have the greatest community impact, considering both needs and assets that we bring to the table alongside local, regional and state partners
- Gilpin County CSU Extension results will be discussed with the Board of County Commissioners.

(**Gilpin**: 5 key informant interviews)

Community Surveys

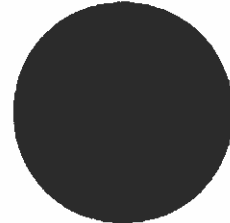
Assess prevalence of issues for which educational resources might have impact

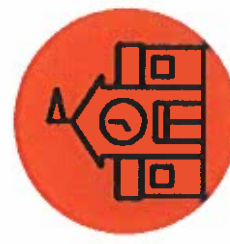

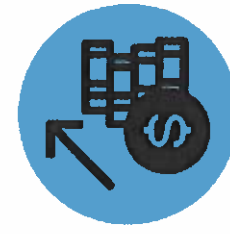

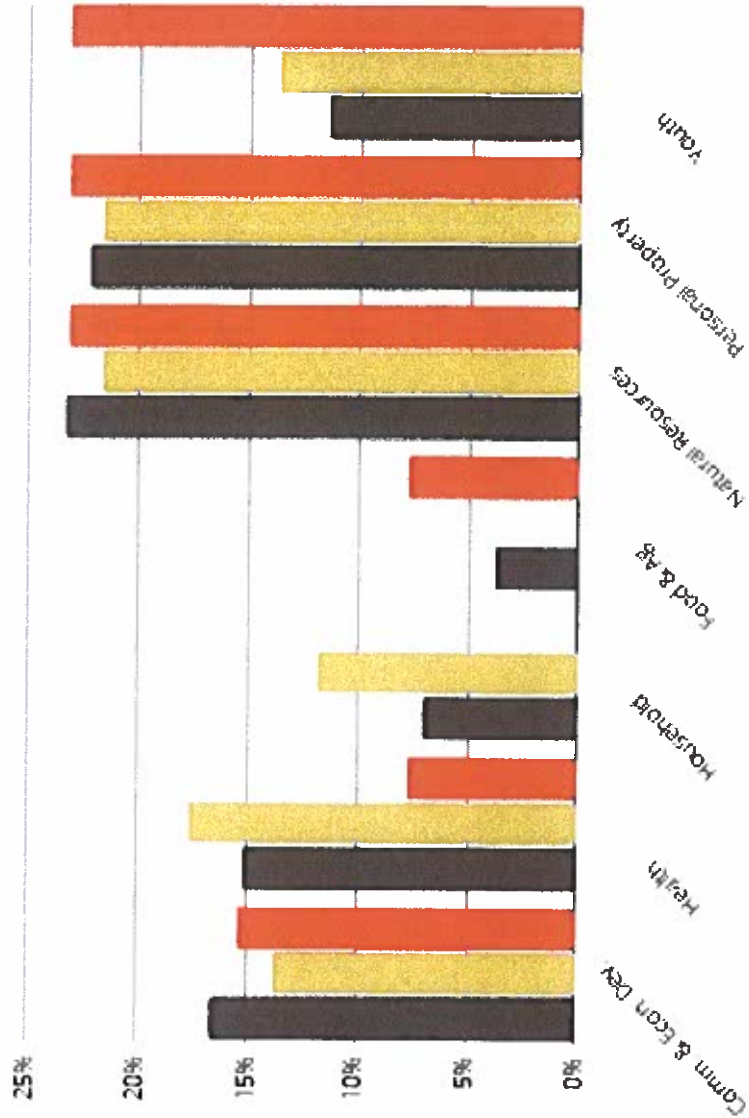

COMMUNITY SOLUTIONS

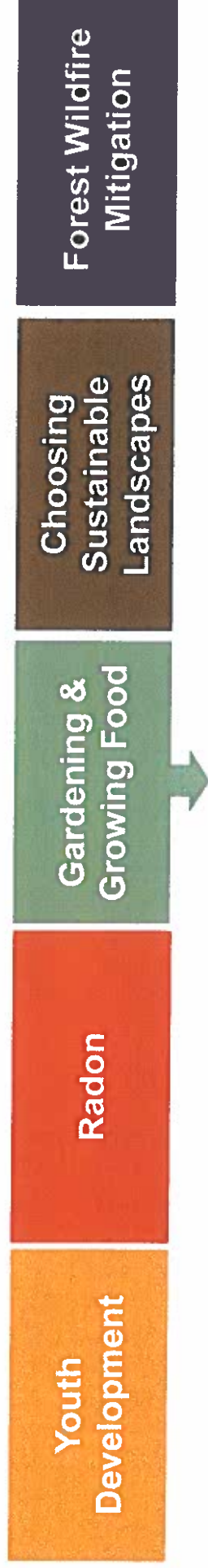
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- Gilpin has 4th highest levels of radon on CO
- Goal – increase radon awareness and number of household tests conducted

COMMUNITY SOLUTIONS

Areas identified that Gilpin CSU Extension will address over the next 5 years



- Residents ranked gardening as an important issue in which they could benefit from education
- Gardening is beneficial to mental and physical health, and promotes healthy aging
- Goal – More residents growing food at community garden
